# Establishing Affectable Spend

- Determine the funding streams where opportunities for participation exist
- Identify new affectable spend programs:
  - Healthcare – Immunizations and WIC Planning
  - Education – Technology Administrative Funds
  - Other Infrastructure – Broadband Mapping
  - Energy – *preliminary* EECBG results
  - Environment – Healthy Homes GrantsTotal new Q2 dollars = \$24,894,340
- Affectable spend to date = \$1,480,395,202



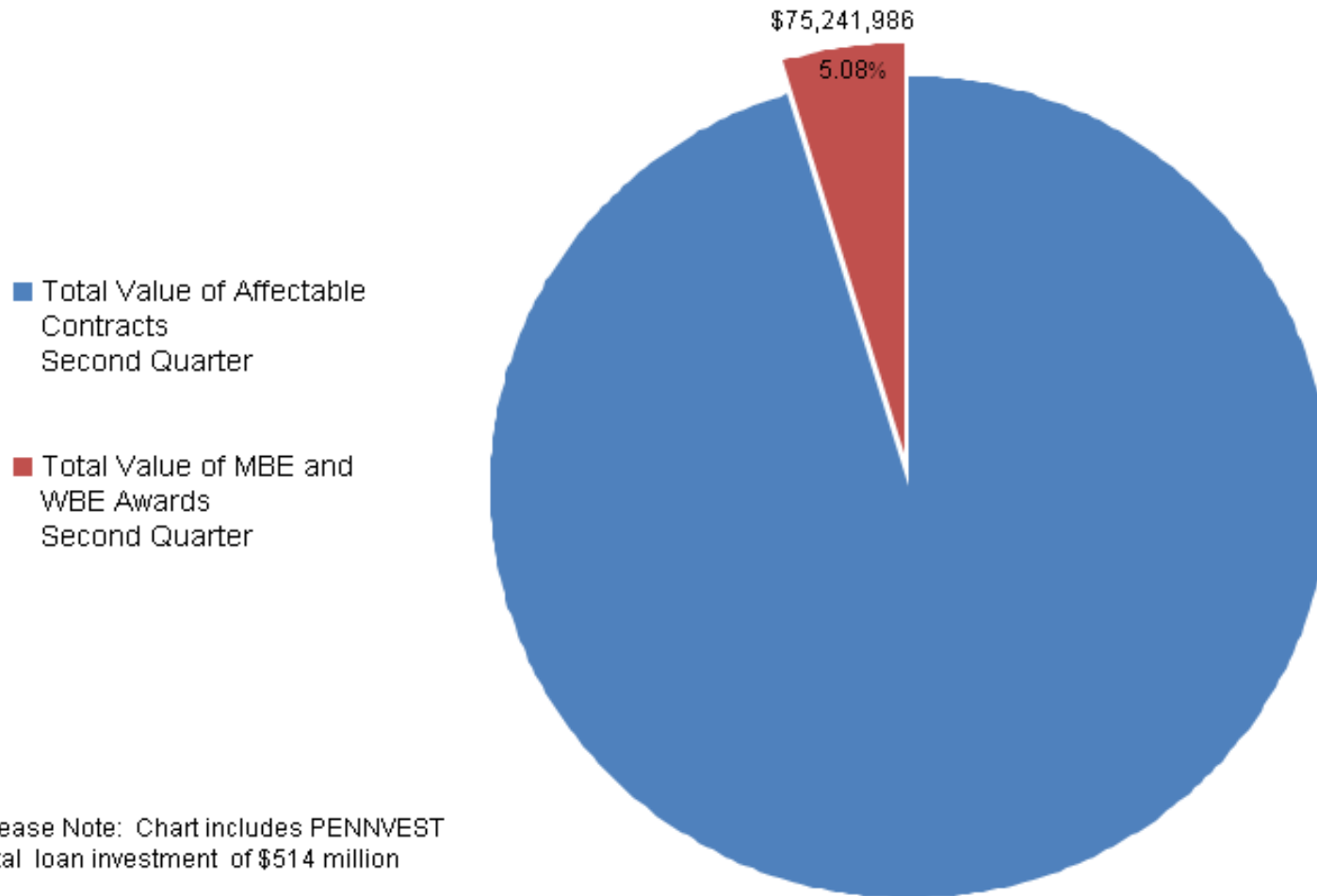
# Agencies Continue to Integrate Program
