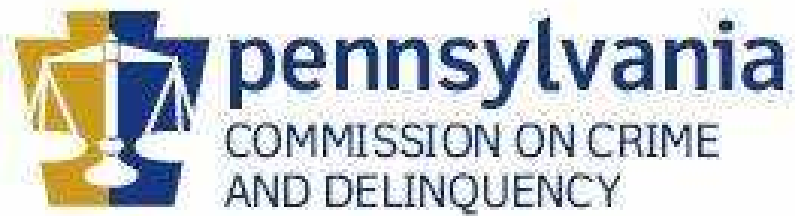
Funding Streams and PCCD Award Totals

1. Victim Compensation: \$1.56 Million
2. VOCA Victim Services: \$1.32 Million
3. STOP Violence Against Women: \$4.9 Million
4. Byrne/JAG Formula: \$45.4 Million



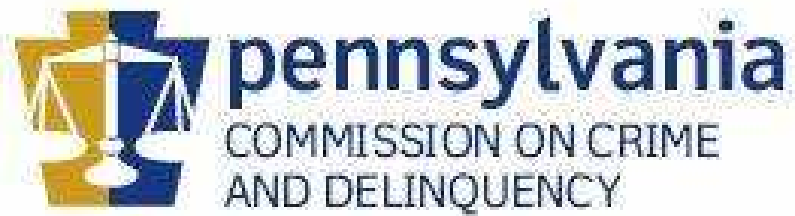
Victim's Compensation

- Funding for losses/costs for victims of violent crimes
 - Counseling, lost wages, limited property, funeral, etc.
- Federal money matches state funds: \$.60 for each \$1 state spending



CURRENT STATUS

- \$1.46 Million (95%) awarded to victims
 - Funding completed by August 5
- \$76,800 (5%) to fund victim education program in hospital emergency rooms
 - To be deployed Spring, 2010



VOCA Victims Services

- Available to agencies providing direct victims services
 - Counseling, assistance with judicial process, assistance in filing compensation claims, etc.
- Formula based distribution to each county



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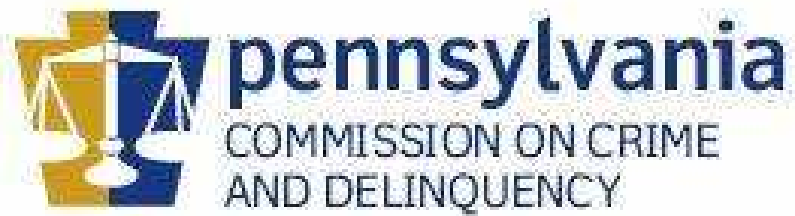
CURRENT STATUS

- Decision to award all ARRA funds to six large VOCA grant recipients
 - Better able to meet ARRA reporting requirements
 - Regular VOCA redistributed to remaining agencies
- \$1,305,396 awarded by September 22, 2009;
 - Grants conclude June 30, 2011
- 17+ FTE jobs created/retained



STOP Violence Against Women

- Funds local coordinated approach to address and improve criminal justice response to sexual assault, domestic violence and stalking
 - Recipients required to develop plan to address these issues
- Funds must be apportioned 25% Police; 25% Prosecutors; 5% Courts; balance for victim services



STOP Violence Against Women, (con't.)

- DOJ must approve PCCD implementation plan
 - ✓ Completed
- Waiver of 25% match requirement sought
 - Counties and local PD's have difficulty providing required cash match



CURRENT STATUS

- 30 applications received by October 20, 2009
- 21 applications (\$3.4 million) approved by Commission on 12/8/09 (see handout)
 - 16 month programs
- Balance will be awarded a March, 2010 Commission meeting
 - Mostly police and prosecutor grants



Byrne/Justice Assistance Grants (JAG)

- Funds may be used to support:
 - Law enforcement
 - Prosecution and courts
 - Prevention and education programs
 - Corrections and community corrections
 - Drug treatment and enforcement programs
 - Planning, evaluation, and technology improvement programs
 - Crime victim and witness programs (other than compensation)



Byrne/JAG (cont'd)

- Formula to each state based on Crime and Population
- 40% of State's Share distributed directly to Local Units of Government by DOJ
- 60% administered by PCCD



Byrne/JAG (con't.)

- Of the 60%:
 - 75% available for programs benefitting local units of government
 - Plan developed by Commission with input from stakeholders and Governor's Office
 - 25% available to state agency programs
 - Plan developed in consultation with Governor's office based on agency requests



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STATE AGENCY AWARDS

- \$ 9.3 Million approved
 - (see “2009 State Agency” handout)
- Funding process begun
 - Delayed by Budget Impasse



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Local Unit of Government Plan

- Commission's final plan for local funding (see handout "PCCD Stimulus Local Byrne/JAG")
 - Budget impasse impacted ability to award grants
 - 9 grants approved in September
 - Funding announcements have been issued for most categories
